Hilary French is a Program Officer at the United Nations Environment Programme's Regional Office for North America, where her work currently focuses on climate change, resource efficiency, and the post-2015 development agenda. She has previously been an advisor to UNEP on a broad range of issues, including consumption and production, green jobs, and globalization and the environment. Ms. French comes to UNEP from the Worldwatch Institute, where she served in diverse capacities, including as Vice President for Research, as Director of the Globalization and Governance Project, as Senior Advisor for Programs, and as a Senior Researcher.

Ms. French has published and lectured widely on global environmental and sustainable development issues, including co-authoring fifteen of Worldwatch's annual *State of the World* reports and authoring the book *Vanishing Borders: Protecting the Planet in the Age of Globalization*. She is also the author of six Worldwatch Papers, including *Partnerships for the Planet: an Environmental Agenda for the United Nations*. Ms. French earlier worked briefly for Ashoka, a global association of social entrepreneurs, and interned with the United Nations Development Programme in the Ivory Coast and with the United Nations Institute for Disarmament Research in Geneva. She has also worked as a consultant to private foundations and as a Visiting Professor at Williams College. She is a graduate of Dartmouth College and of the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy.
