

## State CLE Approval Status

April 29<sup>th</sup> Skills Seminar: Making the Most of Agency Requests for Comments

<b>The following states have been applied to directly and have approved the course for CLE credit, or the application is currently pending:</b>	
<b>CA</b>	This program has been approved by the State Bar of California for 1.75 credit hours.
<b>PA</b>	This activity is approved for 1.5 hours of CLE credit in Pennsylvania.
<b>TX</b>	This course has been approved for Minimum Continuing Legal Education credit by the State Bar of Texas Committee on MCLE in the amount of 1.75 credit hours, of which 0 credit hours will apply to legal ethics/professional responsibility credit.
<b>VT</b>	This course has been approved by the Vermont Board of Mandatory Continuing Legal Education for 1.75 hours of credit.
<b>WA</b>	This course has been approved for 1.75 hours of Washington MCLE credit, including 0 hours of ethics credit.
<b>MO</b>	An application for CLE credit has been submitted to the Missouri Bar and is <i>pending</i> .
<b>VA</b>	An application for CLE credit has been submitted to the MCLE Board of the Virginia State Bar and is <i>pending</i> .
<b>IL</b>	An application for CLE credit has been submitted to the MCLE Board of the Supreme Court of Illinois and is <i>pending</i> .
<b>There is reciprocity between the below states and at least one of the above approved states. Attorney is responsible for confirming.</b>	
<b>ND</b>	Policy 1.14: Out-of-State Courses. Courses sponsored by state bar associations are presumptively approved, as are courses approved by a CLE body of a state with mandatory CLE.
<b>NJ</b>	Any CLE activity or course that is approved for credit by any state that also requires mandatory continuing legal education for its Bar presumptively shall be deemed approved by the Board.
<b>NY</b>	This course is accredited by Pennsylvania, a New York Approved Jurisdiction, for 1.5 substantive 60-minute hours of CLE credit.
<b>WI</b>	Except for repeated on-demand programs as defined in SCR 31.01(6m), self-study courses as defined in CLE 1.02, and courses explicitly disapproved in Wisconsin, courses approved for CLE credit by, and attended in, any other state are deemed approved for the same number of hours and for the same purposes in Wisconsin.

<b>WV</b>	All Association for Continuing Legal Education (ACLEA) members are considered as presumptively accredited providers in West Virginia
