What is Mitigation?



- Significantly reduce or permanently eliminate future risk to lives and property from natural hazards
- ▶ How?
- Planning
- Project implementation

Mitigation's Value to Society

- Create safer communities by reducing losses of life and property
- Enables individuals to recover more rapidly from disasters
- Lessens the financial impact on individuals, communities, and society as a whole.
 - Multi-hazard Mitigation Council shows that each dollar spent on mitigation saves society an average of four dollars.

Grant Funding Sources



- Disaster
 - Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP)
 - 15% of Public Assistance \$
 - EXAMPLE: 4069
 - PA: \$45 million
 - HMGP \$6.75 million
- Non-Disaster
 - Pre-Disaster Mitigation- Competitive (PDM)

Do NOT have to be a **declared** county/jurisdiction

DR-4131 and DR-4113

Projects: \$2.8m

Plans: \$223k

5% Initiative: \$160k

Cost Share: 75/25

Mitigation Grant Eligibility

- Homeland Security and Emergency Management
- Current Local All-Hazard Mitigation Plan (Update)
- Project identified in Plan
- Local jurisdictions in State
 - City, County, Tribal, non-profit
- Cost Share 75%/25%

Application Process



- Disaster Notice of Available Funds
- Application
- Benefit Cost Analysis
- Environmental Historic Preservation
- State and FEMA review takes time!
- Award 3 year period of performance
- Closeout

Plans and Projects



- All-Hazard Mitigation Plan
 - Required and updated 5 year cycle
- Projects
 - Acquisition of flood prone structures
 - Power-line retrofit
 - Tornado safe rooms
 - Wildfire retrofit
 - Minor localized flood reduction
