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


Trend: Enforcement Case Initiations in EPA Region 5 and Region 7

- Region 5 (Minnesota, Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio)
- ▶ Region 7 (Kansas, Missouri, Iowa, Nebraska)




Trend: Major Facilities in Significant Noncompliance with Clean Water Act in EPA Region 5 and Region 7

Significant Noncompliance trending upward in last few years




Trend: Civil Penalties Recovered in CWA-NPDES Enforcement in EPA Region 5 and Region 7

FY 2018 and FY 2019 lowest penalty amounts in last few years




Potential Causes: Less Staff in EPA Region 5, Region 7, and Agency-wide

► Trends in personnel level at Region 5 and 7 coincide with Agency-wide reductions



Potential Causes: Less Enforcement Funding and Even Less Enforcement Spending at EPA

- Adjusted for inflation (2019 reference point)
- Note growing disconnect between funding and spending beginning in FY 2017

What Can a Biden Administration Do to Reverse Enforcement Trends? 1 of 2

- Request larger budget for EPA's enforcement work
 - ▶ \$280 million would bring enforcement budget to FY 2012 levels after adjusting for inflation (FY 2019 budget was only \$240 million)
- ► Request larger budget for EPA's compliance monitoring work
 - Not covered in this presentation, but \$120 million would bring it back to FY 2012 levels after adjusting for inflation (FY 2019 budget was only \$101 million)
- Request additional appropriations for EPA to provide enforcement-focused grants to State Environmental Agencies
 - ▶ Allowing states to hire more enforcement personnel and make up for budget cuts elsewhere that impact enforcement capabilities

What Can a Biden Administration Do to Reverse Enforcement Trends? 2 of 2

- Spend all the money appropriated by Congress
 - Renew institutional commitment to enforcement with more enforcement-focused initiatives
 - ► Hire more enforcement personnel
- Appoint EPA and DOJ officials with demonstrated commitment to environmental protection and enforcement
 - Work to repair the morale at the Agency
- Promulgate stronger standards regulation air emissions, water discharges, and waste handling/disposal
 - Stronger standards require more enforcement
