North American Women in Water Diplomacy Network Inception and Development Proposal November 2023



The Women in Water Diplomacy Network is a community of practice comprised of both formal and informal women decision-makers and experts, representing a wealth of collective experience and expertise in transboundary water management and decision-making engaged in some of the most water insecure regions of the world. Originating in the Nile Basin in 2017, the Network is now a global community of women water leaders (and male champions supporting gender equality) working collectively to strengthen women's leadership in transboundary water decision-making. Support comes from a growing global coalition of partners across Africa, Asia, Europe, and the Americas.

North American representatives have been actively involved in the Women in Water Diplomacy Network since the 2022 launch of the Network's Global Strategy 'A Path Forward for Women, Water, Peace and Security'. The Global Strategy is designed to be an adaptable tool to support the development and deepening of dialogue across transboundary settings, broadly construed. During the Network's Global Strategy launch event at the Stockholm World Water Week 2022, International Joint Commission Commissioner Merrell-Ann Phare endorsed the Global Strategy and encouraged its adoption across North America. "There has never been a more important time for a Network like this to exist. The challenges we are facing are so significant — while we all face them — the impacts are most severely on those that are marginalized and vulnerable. We all have the opportunity to benefit from this Network." At Women in Water Diplomacy Network events organized alongside the 2023 UN Water Conference, North American champions were joined by the International Boundary and Water Commission and other core partners, further building momentum to establish a North American Women in Water Diplomacy Network.

Building on this momentum, the North American Women in Water Diplomacy Network (NA-WWDN) will be launched on the side of the 2023 Colorado River Water Users Association (CRWUA). To date the NA-WWDN has received in-kind and seed support from partners including the Stockholm International Water Institute, the Environmental Law Institute, the International Joint Commission, the International Boundary and Waters Commission, the

University of Arizona's Water Resources Research Center and Udall Center for Studies in Public Policy, the Colorado River Indian Tribes, the Indigenous Women's Leadership Network, the Lincoln Institute of Land Policy, the National Audubon Society, the Gila River Indian Community and Colorado River Indian Tribes with specific support for the December 2023 launch event provided by the Walton Family Foundation, the Southern Nevada Water Authority, the Central Arizona Project, the Salt River Project, the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California, N-Drip, Montgomery and Associates, Freeport McMoRan and Stantec.

To support the development of the NA-WWDN, the following prioritized activities are envisioned at an estimated direct cost of approximately \$300,000 over two years. To date \$50,000 has been leveraged by partners.
